



Day 1: Fly to Scotland

Meet your group and travel on an overnight flight to Glasgow or Edinburgh.

Day 2: Edinburgh

Arrive in Scotland: If you've arrived in Edinburgh, you'll head for the center of this classic medieval city; if you've arrived in Glasgow, you'll enjoy a short but scenic bus ride to the Scottish capital. Depending on your arrival time, you may have free time to settle in and explore on your own.

Explore Edinburgh: Get acquainted with Edinburgh as you follow your Tour Director on a walking tour of the city. Venture between classic sights in the shadow of Edinburgh Castle, which towers above.

Dinner: Tonight, gather with your group for a delicious meal.

Day 3: Edinburgh

Sightseeing tour of Edinburgh: On your tour, see the homes of Alexander Graham Bell and Robert Louis Stevenson. Explore Edinburgh's New Town, which was constructed in the 1800s and remains a shining example of city planning today. At Calton Hill take in views of the Lomond Hills of Fife. Pass by the Palace of Holyroodhouse, the Royal Family's official residence in Scotland. Then, stroll down the Royal Mile through the Old Town, a romantic jumble of medieval buildings.

Edinburgh Castle: Perched atop a dormant volcano, Edinburgh Castle is the enduring symbol of Scotland's capital. Here, Mary Queen of Scots gave birth to James VI, who would later rule England as James I.

Free afternoon in Edinburgh: Enjoy free time in Edinburgh. Check out the Edinburgh Zoo or take photos of the surrounding hills and dazzling seascapes.

Day 4: Edinburgh

Industry Engagement Experience: Get a first-hand look at business practices within the U.K. on your visit to a local business.

St. Andrews: Spend the day visiting charming St. Andrews, famous as a university town and as the birthplace of golf. Each year, the city hosts the British Open major tournament on its fabled course.

Day 5: Edinburgh | London

Travel by train to London: Get your camera ready as your train comes to a stop in one of the world's historic, cultural, and economic epicenters.

Walking tour of London: Ready to see London on foot? Stretch your legs and set out through Trafalgar Square, Covent Garden, the Strand, and Leicester Square on a walking tour of the city.

Day 6: London

Sightseeing tour of London: From Big Ben to the Houses of Parliament, Great Britain's royal tradition and rich history greet you at every turn. Admire architectural marvels like St. Paul's Cathedral, and check out the five-way intersection at Piccadilly Circus and the urban greenery of Hyde Park. You may even get a chance to witness the ceremonial Changing of the Guard.

Tower of London: Pay a visit to the complex that has been a part of British rule for nearly a millennium. Nestled against the banks of the Thames, the castle and its surrounding edifices most famously served as a place of punishment, but have also enjoyed tenures as an armory, a mint, and a treasury. You'll see the

famous White Tower, built by William the Conqueror in 1066, and the fabulous Crown Jewels of the United Kingdom.

Free time: Explore London at your own pace for the rest of the day.

Day 7: London

Industry Engagement Experience: As a world leader in business, financial services, and culture, London is known for its prominent role in the global market. Central London serves not only as a major tourist destination, but also as the home for more than half of the United Kingdom's top 100 companies. Enjoy a visit to one of London's leading businesses.

Windsor Castle: In this former fortress, see priceless objects in the State Apartments, like paintings by Rubens and Holbein. Encounter the Gothic splendor of St. George's Chapel, final resting place of many monarchs including Henry VIII. Take a look into the miniature world of Queen Mary's Dolls' House, where castle items are replicated in 1/12th scale—including functional lighting and plumbing systems.

Dinner: Enjoy a fish and chips dinner with your group.

Day 8: Depart for home

Arrive at the airport and check in for your flight home.
